

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

You will see that there are two charges for water and two for wastewater, one being for the actual amount of water consumed (as recorded by the water meter) and the other being a daily fixed charge. Not only was it onerous to pay twice for water and wastewater (i.e. two kinds of charges), but worst of all was that the wastewater (refer "Consumption charges" under the Details heading) was charged at 174% of the amount of water consumed. My hope is that the water charges for this region will neither be exorbitant nor unfair.
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
