





Tensions and challenges:

Centralisation-Decentralisation dynamic
Local government funding constraints
Increased pressure on natural resources
Lack of detail and certainty on reforms
Current models unsustainable

Levers and opportunities:

Partnership opportunities (Iwi, central Government, regional, community)

Upholding Te Titiri obligations and principles

Focus on integrated wellbeing and local democracy / citizenship
