New Earthquake Prone Buildings System



FIVE STEPS TO REMEMBER:

- 1 Council identifies potentially EQ Prone buildings, lets owners know
- 2 Owner gets assessment, sends to Council
- 3 Council decides whether EQ Prone, if building EQ prone then Council must issue notice and list on national register
- 4 Owner displays EQ Prone notice on their building
- 5 Owner undertakes seismic work

TIMEFRAMES

Council must identify potentially EQ Prone buildings by:	1 July 2022 (all buildings)
	1 Jan 2020 (priority buildings)
Buildings owners must get work done (from date of getting notice in Step 3)	15 years (all buildings)
	7.5 years (priority buildings)
